

Sivery at large are of Opinion that the Charter should not be printed, at the same time recommend it to the Court to permit any Member of the Sivery to read the Charter upon proper Notice being previously given to the Master for the time being, in whose Custody the said Charter is deposited.

Ordered that a Tin Case and Lock be provided for the Charter-books.
