Letter to  
his Executors

M<sup>r</sup>. J. A. H. France dec<sup>d</sup>.

In the letter to you of the 9<sup>th</sup> April last from me  
and the Wardens of the Musicians Company the unpaid  
Taxen Bills (amounting to £98.4.0) of M<sup>r</sup>. Clarke were  
mentioned and we expected that shortly after receipt by  
you of our letter they would have been paid.

I now enclose copy of a letter from M<sup>r</sup>. Clarke which  
was laid before the Court of Assistants at their meeting on  
Wednesday last and I am requested by the Court to state that  
they rely on your making payment without further delay  
unless you have any reason for nonpayment and if you  
have such reason you will please inform me of it.

Much inconvenience has been occasioned by the  
non-fulfillment of the books &c. referred to in the letter of  
the 9<sup>th</sup> April and by the absence of information with  
respect to the payments to M<sup>r</sup>. Colman to M<sup>r</sup>. France in 1865  
and 1866 of the respective sums of £62.6.0 - £17.11.8 and  
£15.16.8 -
