

### School of Music

2. Proof of having received a fair general education, together with satisfactory references as to character, will be required.
3. Each Candidate will be required to pass a Preliminary Examination in Music consisting of (1) Questions in the Theory of Music; (2) Singing or playing on an instrument any piece prepared; and (3) Reading at sight such pieces as the Examiners may determine. It is imperative that the Candidate shows distinct ability in reading Music at sight. The Examiners are instructed to withhold either Scholarship in the event of no Candidate showing sufficient ability.
4. The successful Candidates will be required to undergo a complete course of training in Music at the Guildhall School of Music, extending over a period of two years.
5. The curriculum will be:-
  - (1) Principal study - Two personal lessons weekly of 20 minutes each in one of the following subjects - Singing, Pianoforte, Violin, Organ, Violincello, Viola, Double Bass, Harp or Wind Instrument.
  - (2) Second study - One personal lesson weekly of 20 minutes in another of the various subjects named in the first section.
  - (3) Harmony and Counterpoint.
  - (4) Choral Class Singing or Orchestral Practice.
6. Holders of the Scholarships will bear the title of "The Musicians' Company S. Ernest Palmer Scholar," and be subject to a periodical report to the Court from the Principal of the School as to their satisfactory progress; the Company expressly reserving to itself the right to withdraw a Scholarship at any time, in the event of the report not being satisfactory. The Scholarship may be extended under special circumstances, at the discretion of the Court of the Company.
7. Candidates for the Scholarships will be required to pay an entrance fee of 10/- on making application to compete, such fee to be returned in the event of the applicant not being accepted for examination.
8. On the expiration of their Scholarships, Students will be expected to present themselves for examination for the Diploma of Licentiatehip of the Guildhall School of Music.
9. It is a condition of each Scholarship that the holder shall conform to the published Regulations of the School.
