

## CONSTANT LAMBERT BLUE PLAQUE

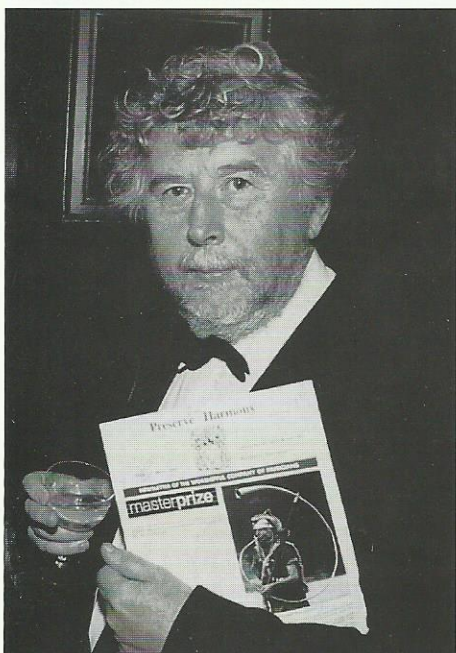
