That a Letter be address'd to M^r Warden Cotterell acquainting him that as the Company's Affairs are still in great Disorder, requiring the most vigorous Exertion to remove, the Court are unwilling to impose such a Burthen as the Office of Master upon him in so critical a State, and therefore ^{have} resolv'd to elect some other Person Master for the ensuing Year.

That the general Quarterly Court be held as usual at the Queen's Arms Tavern in Saint Paul's Church Yard on Wednesday the 28th of October 1772 for the Election of Master Wardens & other Officers for the Year ensuing.

That a Treasurer be annually chosen and that M^r Keating the present Master be appointed to that Office for the following Year.

That the said Treasurer pay all Bills &c due from this Company, ^{thru of the Com^{rs}} provided ^{the} Master or one of the Wardens ^{being one} do sign such Bills
