An application was received from The Royal College of Organists, urging the grant of the Company's Silver Medal to that College, and on the proposition of the Master, seconded by P. M. Sir Homewood Crawford, it was resolved to grant the Company's Medal to the College of Organists once in every three years, the first presentation to be made in 1922.

Mr Hunter called attention to the retirement of Lt. Col. A. J. Stretton, M. V. O. from His Majesty's Army, after holding the office of Director of Music at the Royal Military School of Music for 25 years, and to the great service he had rendered to military music, and after discussion P. M. Sir Homewood Crawford gave notice of his intention to move at the next Court a resolution that the Silver Medal of the Company be presented to Lt. Col. Stretton.

An application by and on behalf of Mr William Henry Sellick for a donation towards the expense of paying his entrance fees for the L. R. S. M. Examination, was read, but it was decided that such application was not within the scope of the Company's funds, and that same must be refused with regret.

On the proposition of P. M. Sir Homewood Crawford, seconded by Mr Leslie, Mr Herman Darowski of 122 and 124 Chocung Cross Road, Music Publisher, was unanimously elected a member of the Company, subject to his being of British Nationality.

P. M. Hoblyn moved that Sir William J. Lancaster, J.P. be elected Master for the ensuing year. This was seconded by P. M. Sir Homewood Crawford, and carried unanimously, and the Master elect briefly returned thanks.

On the proposition of Sir William J. Lancaster, seconded by P. M. Wyll, a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to the retiring Master Mr Henry Thomas Hart de
