Mr J. C. Colclard said he felt bound to object to elections to the Court by selection instead of by seniority but he stated that Mr Alfred Moul who stood next on the List of Servicemen would not come forward. Sir Homewood Crawford strongly supported the election of Colonel Shaw-Heller and it was carried unanimously
