The Court proceeded to take into consideration the
return to be made under the Bill, commonly called the
Income Bill, when, on examining the Company's Finances
it was found that the receipt by fines on the admission
of Freemen &c. were, as near as might be, equivalent to
their Donations in Charity & Civil Establishment, it was
agreed ^{therefore} on motion that a return be made on their Stock
which was £4900, but that the same be considered
on this occasion as £5000 -
