

The Worshipful Company of Musicians I have the honour to inform your Lordship that thanks to the generosity of their Honorary Freeman Mr Andrew Carnegie the Company has founded two Scholarships entitling the Holders to three years free tuition at the Guildhall School of Music at the expense of the Company subject to their giving proof of educational proficiency and passing satisfactorily a Preliminary Musical Examination

For the information of your Lordship and the Corporation I beg to enclose a statement of the regulations framed by the Musicians Company in connection with such Scholarships by which it will be seen that it is imperative that candidates for the Scholarships should give proof of distinct ability in reading Music at sight

It is proposed to hold the first Examination in time to admit of the successful Scholars commencing their Studies at the Guildhall School of Music in January next
