

And, as it has been customary to give the Whifflers and Standard Bearer five Shillings each and also their Provision of the day, which latter Article creates much Confusion and unnecessary Expence, the Committee recommend, that in lieu thereof they do severally receive the sum of Seven Shillings and sixpence and defray therout their own Expences.

The Result therefore of the Committees Inquiries and Recommendations are, that, for the reasons before stated, the Jury should not be summoned to attend the Procession - but, that sixteen Members of the Court of Assistants of this Company should meet at the Guildhall, thence to go to the Mansion House on the Morning of the 8th (robed) to Breakfast - thence to proceed in Coaches to Guildhall, taking the left of the Lord Mayor, and attend his Lordships being sworn in - after which Ceremony they are to return to the Mansion House to Dinner taking the right in the Procession.

That on the 9th Sixteen Members of the Court meet at the Justice Room in Guildhall Yard, thence proceed to the Water-side with Music and Colours flying, and properly attended according to the form before given; thence in Coaches to Westminster Hall to introduce His Lordships to the Courts, after which to the Temple to wait His Lordships re-landing, there discharge the Coaches and walk in Procession with like Ceremony to Guildhall - then adjourn to Dinner.

The Committee further beg leave to state that in their different Meetings to conduct this business.
