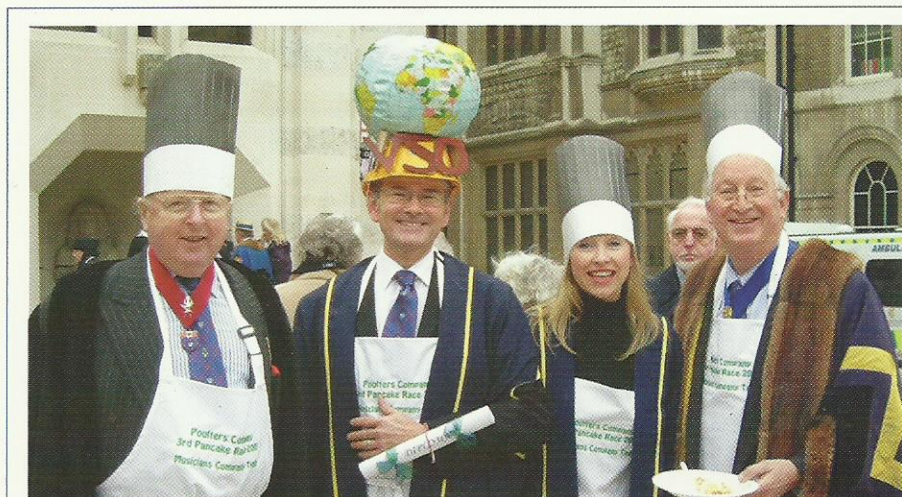
## EDITORIAL TEAM

A keen singer, Jeff has been a member of several choirs over a period of nearly forty years and has gained enormous pleasure from being actively involved in music-making. 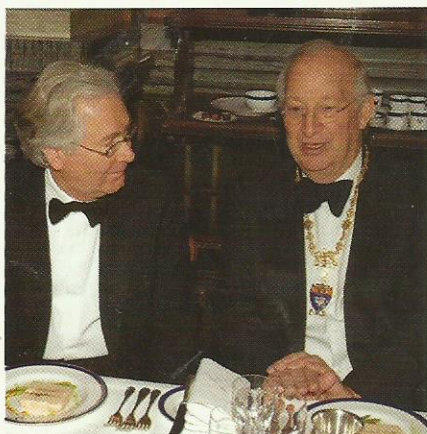
