

The Clerk therefore of our Company was instructed to approach Mr Saxe Wyndham the Secretary of the Guildhall School of Music in order to ascertain if that School would in future send out the proper notices and bear all the incidental expenses incurred thereby Mr Saxe Wyndham agreed to all these conditions and said that the School would be quite prepared to undertake these duties in the above connection

Only 5 candidates came forward on the last occasion when this Scholarship was thrown open

We therefore recommend the Court to accept these arrangements with the following proviso:— That the School be asked to submit for the approval of the Musicians Company the names of the proposed examiners of any candidates for the vacant scholarships at the Guildhall School of Music and that the Company be allowed to appoint one Examiner to whom the usual fee given in such cases shall be paid by the above mentioned Institution
