The Report of the Collard Committee held on 10th October 1934
was received as follows:-

Your Committee met on the 10th October 1934 at the Royal Society's
Club W.1. and beg to report as follows.

1. The procedure for the adjudication committee on the 15th inst.
was discussed and determined.
2. The Clerk reported that Sir Landon Ronald F.R.A.M., F.R.C.M.,
F.G.S.M., and Dr. Arnold Bax F.R.A.M., F.R.C.M., had consented
to act as Referees.
3. Upon the report of the Clerk that the Inland Revenue having
repaid to Mr. Howells such sums as had been paid by him on
account of Income tax on the Fellowship monies, it might be
presumed that there was no intention on their part of appealing
against the decision of the Commissioners that the Fellowship
was not assessable to tax, but that in resisting the assessment
to tax Mr. Howells had been put to expenses totalling £45-5-0
