

It was pointed out that it was open to any Member of the Court to nominate a Liveryman on these grounds when any vacancy on the Court occurred, such nomination to be considered in addition to the names of the six Liverymen next in rotation referred to in the instructions given to the Clerk on the 27th April 1915.

It was decided to take the items in the Report verbatim.

Past Master Edgar questioned Clause 1 and Past Master Sir Homewood Crawford explained the views of the Committee.

Past Master Edgar moved as an amendment that all words after the word "City" be deleted. This was seconded by Sir Ernest Clarke and on being put to the vote was declared to be carried.
