

The Stamp Book of Duties on the Admission of  
Freemen into this Company was next examined  
and it appears that the sum of Five pounds  
has been paid for the same. Being all  
which is due thereon to this day.

The List of Freemen of this Company was then  
examined, and the Clerk was directed to write  
preemptorily to several, to desire them to  
take up their Liveries respectively, or shew  
cause (if any) to the contrary at the ensuing  
Quarterly Court.
