

Quartermage for which Poundage paid to the Beadle

 the said account your Committee are induced to  
 recommend to this Court to give up the sum of £18 15.3  
 being ~~the~~ a moiety of the said sum of £37.10.6 which  
 will then leave a Ballance of £289 2 11. due to  
 this Company and which is admitted by Mr Hegden  
 in behalf of Mr Hardy as a fair and equitable  
 adjustment all which we submit this 26<sup>th</sup> day of  
 March 1802.

Whereupon it is referred back to the said Committee  
 to proceed for the recovery of the Ballance due to this  
 Company from the said Mr Thomas Hardy in such  
 manner as they shall think fit and they are hereby  
 authorized (if they find it necessary to adjust the  
 same without proceedings at Law) to admit a  
 deduction of the moiety as stated in the said Report.
