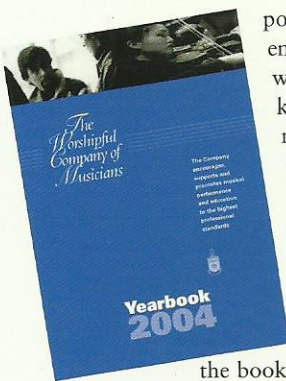


## THE NEW COMPANY YEARBOOK - YOUR COMMENTS
