Sale of Freeholds The Clerk reported that P. M. Burnett Brown had been kind enough to inspect some of the Company's properties which the Lessees had offered to purchase and he read P. M. Burnett Brown's letter.

On the proposition of Mr. E. H. Ryde, seconded by P. M. Edgar it was decided that the Clerk in consultation with the Treasurer be authorised to sell any of the Company's ground rents at an amount of not less than 27 years' purchase and that the opportunity to purchase be offered first to the present assignees.

British Broadcasting Corporation The Clerk read a letter from the B. B. C. asking for the Company's co-operation in making known to composers that the Corporation welcomed new music. Enclosed with it was a circular which had been sent to all Schools of Music. It was ordered that the paper should lie on the table.

Augener Ltd The Clerk read a letter from Messrs Augener Ltd offering their assistance in publishing old registers of the Company supplemented with biographical notes.
