The Clerk reported the sudden death of the Treasurer Past Master John Clementi Hollard on the 2nd August last and on the proposition of the Master seconded by the Senior Warden it was resolved "That this Court desire to place on record the grief of the members at the death of their Treasurer Past Master John Clementi Hollard, and their high appreciation of the distinguished and valuable services rendered by him over so long a period to the Company, and offer their most sincere condolence to his Widow and to the members of his family

The Clerk also reported that the late Past Master J. G. Hollard had bequeathed the Company an unconditional Legacy of £100, free of duty and a contingent reversionary share in his Estate and the following Extract from his Will was ordered to be entered on the Minutes -

"I declare that the share in my Residuary Trust Fund herinbefore given to each of my two sons John Clementi Hollard and Cecil Clementi Hollard shall not vest absolutely in him but shall be retained and held by my Trustees upon the trusts hereinafter declared concerning the same (that is to say) Upon trust to pay the income of such share to my same son during his life and from and after the death of my same son in trust both as to the capital and income of such share for all or any the children or child and remote issue of my same son living at his decease who being male shall attain the age of 21 years or being female shall attain that age or marry under that age in equal shares And in case there shall be no such child or remote issue who shall take a vested interest then the said share or shares (as the case may be) shall be held as to one moiety of the capital and income thereof In
