Trinity College of Music

In pursuance of notice Sir Homewood Crawford moved that Trinity College of Music should be included in the list of Recipients of the Company's Silver Medals and suggested that such Medal should be given every third year in the same manner as it was given to the three other Colleges of Music in London.

The Motion was seconded by D^r Southgate and strongly supported by Sir Frederick Bridge but was opposed by Sir Edward Cooper, M^r Hunter and others. On a vote being taken the resolution was carried by a majority of one.

St Cecilia Celebration

A letter was read from the Rev. J. Childs-Clark the Succentor of St Paul's Cathedral stating that the Dean & Chapter would welcome with great pleasure the presence of the Musicians' Company at the St Cecilia Celebration on Monday the 23rd November and mentioning the Music it was proposed to sing.

Having regard to the national crisis through the War it was decided to urge as many Members as possible to attend the Service and the Clerk was instructed to communicate with the Succentor with a view to having specially appropriate music rendered.
