A letter was read from P. M. Fuller in reply to the vote of thanks accorded him on his resigning the post of Treasurer.

"A Quorum"

The Clerk reported that there was nothing in the Charter or Bylaws of the Company as to what constituted "a quorum" and suggested the making of a further Bye-law by the Court under the power to that effect, contained in the Charter. And on the proposition of the Master, seconded by the Senior Warden, it was, after discussion, unanimously resolved that the following should be added to the existing Bye-laws viz:-

"The Master, or failing him, the immediate Past Master, shall be the Chairman of all Meetings of the Court of Assistants, but if neither of them be present, a Chairman shall be elected ^{first} from the Past Masters, who shall be present, and if there shall be none present then the Chairman shall be elected from the Members of the Court.

"Seven Members present shall form a quorum, but no Resolution dealing with the property of the Company shall be passed, unless by a majority in the proportion of 2 to 1 of the Members present, and voting upon the Resolution.

"The Chairman shall have a casting vote."
