Referring to our conversation of Friday last I should
 be most happy to carefully inspect, on a house to house visit,
 the various properties comprised in the Statement you were good
 enough to hand to me.

My fee for so doing would be on the basis of Three
 Guineas per day for the whole time occupied with out of
 pocket expenses.

I should roughly estimate the time necessary
 altogether at about three days.

In the event of my finding the premises,
 or any of them, in such a condition as to render it un-
 advisable to draw up Schedules of Dilapidations and to serve

voices upon the Lessees. I would suggest that the latter be required to pay the consequent Surveyor's fees, thus relieving your Company from any expense beyond that in respect of the preliminary Survey.
