Royal Naval School of Music } A meeting of the Committee to consider the question of obtaining permission of the respective authorities for the wearing of the Royal Military School of Music Musicians Company's medals granted to the Students of the Royal Military and Naval Schools of Music was held on July 1st 1910

After discussion it was resolved to recommend to the Court that the Committee be authorised to prepare a Memorial for presentation to the War Office and the Admiralty pointing out the object the Company has in view in bestowing these medals as an encouragement for music in the two Services, mentioning the recent Competition for pieces of Military music and the desire to help British musical art as far as possible And asking that when the recipients of these Medals are engaged on strictly musical duties they should be accorded permission to wear the medals

It is suggested that these Memorials should be formally presented to the two Departments by a deputation of members from the Committee already appointed
