The Committee proceeded to examine the Account of the late
Master, Article by Article, and declar'd the Balance of Cash
remaining in M^r Treasurer Keating's Hands to be Two Hundred
and Sixty four Pounds Nine shillings and One
penny Halfpenny Besides the Sum of Eight Hundred
Pounds in Old South Sea Annuities vested, in Trust for the
Company, in the Names of Mess^{rs} Keating Staples & Spencer.

Master Ashton appointed the next Quarterly Court
to be held, as usual, at the Queen's Arms Tavern in Saint Pauls
Church Yard on Thursday the 28.th January 1773.

M^r Treasurer Keating settled the Beadles Account and paid
him £4.16.0 being in full to this Day.
