Resolved and Ordered

That D<sup>r</sup> Bridge be requested to kindly undertake the musical arrangements.

M<sup>r</sup> Theobald moved

That the sum of £200. be voted to meet the current expenses.

Seconded by M<sup>r</sup> Jones

Carried unanimously.

D<sup>r</sup> Bridge gave notice that at the next Court he would move as follows:

That a silver Medal be presented by the Company annually to the most distinguished Student, male or female, at the following Musical Institutions viz. The Royal Academy of Music, The Royal College of Music and the Guildhall School of Music, in rotation. The recipient to be nominated without competition or examination by the Principal or Director of <sup>each</sup> the above named three Institutions, assisted in each case by two of his principal Professors to be named by himself.

And also he would move

That a gold Medal of the Company be awarded from time to time to some distinguished person <sup>as may hereafter be determined by the Board</sup> who should add a valuable contribution to musical composition or musical literature and in the case of very distinguished merit
