Sir Homewood Crawford read the Report of the Committee appointed at the last Court which is as follows:—

To The Worshipful Master, Wardens, and Court of Assistants  
of the Worshipful Company of Musicians.

Gentlemen,

At a Court Meeting held on the 20<sup>th</sup> January last it was unanimously resolved, on the Motion of Sir Homewood Crawford, that to celebrate the 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Company's Incorporation by Royal Charter an exhibition of Musical Instruments and Manuscripts be held under the auspices of the Company in the year 1904 and that it be referred to a committee of not less than seven Members, with power to add to their numbers, to make the necessary arrangements. It was further resolved that the Master, Wardens, Sir Frederick Bridge, Mr John Clementi Collard, Mr Edward Ernest Cooper and Sir Homewood Crawford form the committee, and have power to co-opt additional Members from the Livery.
