

At a Special Court held at Stationers Hall,
E. C. 4 on October 28th 1930 before the Livery Banquet.

Sir Ian Malcolm, K.C.H.G., D.L., J.P., was sworn in as Master

The Clerk reported the death on that day of the Honorary
Chaplain The Right Reverend E. H. Pearce, Bishop of Worcester and
it was resolved that a vote of condolence be passed and that a
letter of condolence be sent to Miss Pearce.

The Clerk reported that the 22nd November had been fixed
for the St. Cecilia's celebration at St. Paul's Cathedral.
